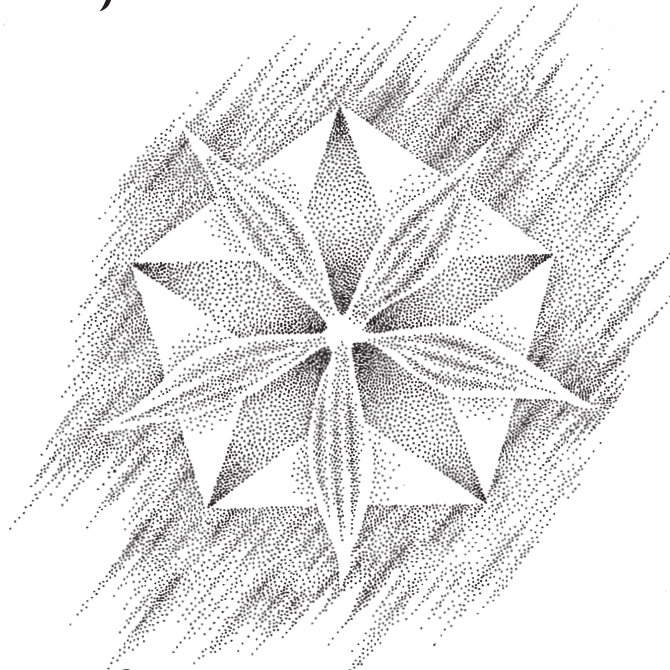

# *Waldorf Summer Intensives 2010*

## *Art Curriculum for Grades 1 through 8 with Anna Gruda*

*Monday June 28 – Wednesday June 30*

This three day arts intensive will offer an overview of the Waldorf grade school art curriculum and explore how different media and processes meet children's inner developmental needs. It will be hands-on and include samples of work gleaned from Anna's many years of teaching. Watercolour painting, clay modeling, and simple printmaking will invigorate your work in the classroom.

## *Mathematical Development of the Teacher*

*with John Grant McLoughlin*

*Monday June 28 – Wednesday June 30*

We will focus attention on the big ideas associated with mathematics in the grades: the four processes; fractions; decimals; geometry; and algebra. These ideas will be explored through participatory activities and methods designed to open new avenues to seeing mathematics. The intent is to foster deeper understanding and mathematical appreciation on the part of the teacher. The spirit of the intensive will allow for personal professional development to be held in an environment of mutual support and mathematical beauty.

## *Preparation for Grade 1 with David Hadden*

*Monday July 5– Thursday July 8*

We shall explore the physical, psychological, and spiritual development of the six and seven year old child and how the curriculum meets the needs of this age. There will be particular focus on practical aspects of teaching grade one, such as planning the year, the block, the day, the lesson, and how to integrate the arts and experiential activities into the daily rhythm. We will also address working with parents and colleagues.

## *The Heart of Childhood, Preparing for Grades 3, 4 and 5*

*with Patrice Maynard and Warren Lee Cohen*

*Monday July 5 – Thursday July 8*

We shall study the physical, psychological and spiritually development of children in the heart of childhood, from age nine to twelve and explore how the Waldorf curriculum meets their needs. We'll practice artistic activities including singing, recitation, modeling, form drawing and spatial dynamics both to strengthen ourselves as teachers and to prepare appropriate examples for the curriculum in the coming year.

## *Presenters*

### *Warren Lee Cohen*

Warren is the director of Waldorf Teacher Education at RSCT. He has been working in Waldorf education and comes to us from England where he directed the Foundation Year Program at Emerson College. Warren is the author of **Raising the Soul: practical exercises for personal development** and **Baking Bread with Children**. He is an experienced class teacher, a sculptor and an avid bread baker.

### *John Grant McLoughlin*

John is a professor of mathematics education at University of New Brunswick. John has taught in Waldorf teacher education programs here and at Sunbridge College. He has offered numerous mathematical workshops with elementary teachers in various contexts ranging from provincial conferences to staff development and initiatives such as CHIRON with which he has been involved for nine years.

### *Anna Gruda*

Anna is a graduate of the Ontario College of Art and Design and the Rudolf Steiner Centre Toronto (RSCT) teacher education program. She has taught the primary grades at Edgehill Country Waldorf School and art at the Alan Howard Waldorf School. She works in adult education at the RSCT and gives weekly painting workshops at Hesperus Fellowship Community. She is an exhibiting artist and currently teaches art at Toronto Waldorf School.

### *David Hadden*

David is teaching his third cycle as a class teacher at the London Waldorf School where he is now completing Grade 4/5. He attended Emerson College in England for Foundation Studies and the Waldorf Teacher Education year. He has a Bachelor of Music and a Bachelor of Education and is an avid painter

### *Patrice Maynard*

Patrice is the Leader of Outreach & Development for AWSNA with a specialty in teaching music, speech, drama, clay, and incorporating sword and Morris dancing into the curriculum. Patrice has 13 years of Waldorf class teaching experience at Hawthorne Valley School in Harlemville, NY.
