

Birth-to-Seven Years

Full-Time, One-Year Certificate Program

The full-time Waldorf EC program requires one year of study at our campus north of Toronto. The focus of this program is on Waldorf early childhood education. However, experience shows that it is important that EC teachers are aware of the whole educational journey. Courses in Waldorf grade school and high school education make this program comprehensive.

HIGHLIGHTS

- Study of the philosophical and practical foundations of Waldorf education
- 10 weeks of teaching practice in Waldorf classrooms
- Artistic explorations to awaken imaginative faculties and craft work to develop practical skills
- Inner development of the teacher and festivals of the year

CERTIFICATION

On completion of all course requirements, the student will receive a **Certificate of Course Completion in Waldorf Early Childhood Teacher Education**. This course is recognized by the *Waldorf Early Childhood Association of North America* (WECAN) and by the *International Association for Steiner/Waldorf Early Childhood Education* (IASWECE).

Birth-To-Seven Years

Part-Time, Two-year Certificate Program

The two-year, part-time certificate program covers the essentials of Waldorf early childhood from birth-to-seven years. It prepares currently practising teachers and assistants for the challenges of working in a Waldorf kindergarten, nursery, playgroup, parent-and-child, or child-care setting. Each year is made up of a three-week intensive session in the summer, together with a one-week session each fall and spring.

HIGHLIGHTS

- Anthroposophical understanding of the development of the human being from birth to adulthood, based on the research of Rudolf Steiner
- Emphasis on the developmental needs of the child from pre-birth to three, the nursery child, and the kindergarten-age child, including remedial needs
- Development of the inner life of the teacher through biography work, artistic activities, singing, Eurythmy, and meditative practice
- Creating a nurturing environment for the child's life forces to offset the impact of the modern milieu in such areas as nutrition, life style, and media exposure
- Domestic, artistic, and practical activities in the classroom
- Festivals and the cycle of the year
- Building a strong community life, working with parents and colleagues
- Classroom management and creative discipline
- Guided independent study: child observation, assigned reading, and individual research. Each student has an experienced teacher as a mentor

CERTIFICATION

On completion of all course requirements, the student will receive a **Certificate of Course Completion in Waldorf Early Teacher Childhood Education**. This course is recognized by WECAN and IASWECE.

Birth-to-Three Years

Part-Time, One-Year Certificate Program

The one-year, part-time program covers the essentials of Waldorf early childhood from birth-to-three years. It will prepare currently practising teachers for the challenges and joy of working in a Waldorf nursery, playgroup, parent-and-child, or child care setting. Graduates of this program have the option of joining year two of our birth-to-seven years certificate program.

HIGHLIGHTS

- Anthroposophical understanding of the development of the human being from birth to adulthood, based on the research of Rudolf Steiner
- Essentials of Waldorf Early Childhood Education from birth-to-seven years and preparation of educators working in the first three years, as outlined by WECAN
- Development of the inner life of the teacher through biography work, artistic activities, singing, Eurythmy, festival celebrations and meditative practice
- Creating a nurturing environment for the child's sensory development that offsets the impact of the modern milieu in such areas as nutrition, lifestyle, and media exposure
- Building a strong community life, working with parents and colleagues
- Program management and creative discipline
- The Pikler Institute's research and practice in caregiving and healthy attachment

CERTIFICATION

On completion of all course requirements, the student will receive a **Certificate of Course Completion in Waldorf Early Teacher Childhood Education Birth-to-Three**.

June 17 - July 6, 2018 • Oct. 28 - Nov. 2, 2018 • March 10 - 15, 2019

TUITION: \$5,900 CAD

Prerequisites for Admission

- Part-time program applicants must be currently practicing in a Waldorf early childhood setting
- Full-time program applicants must have prior, documented, teaching experience
- Foundation Studies in Anthroposophy Certificate (see website for details) or equivalent
- Completion of the preparatory reading list
