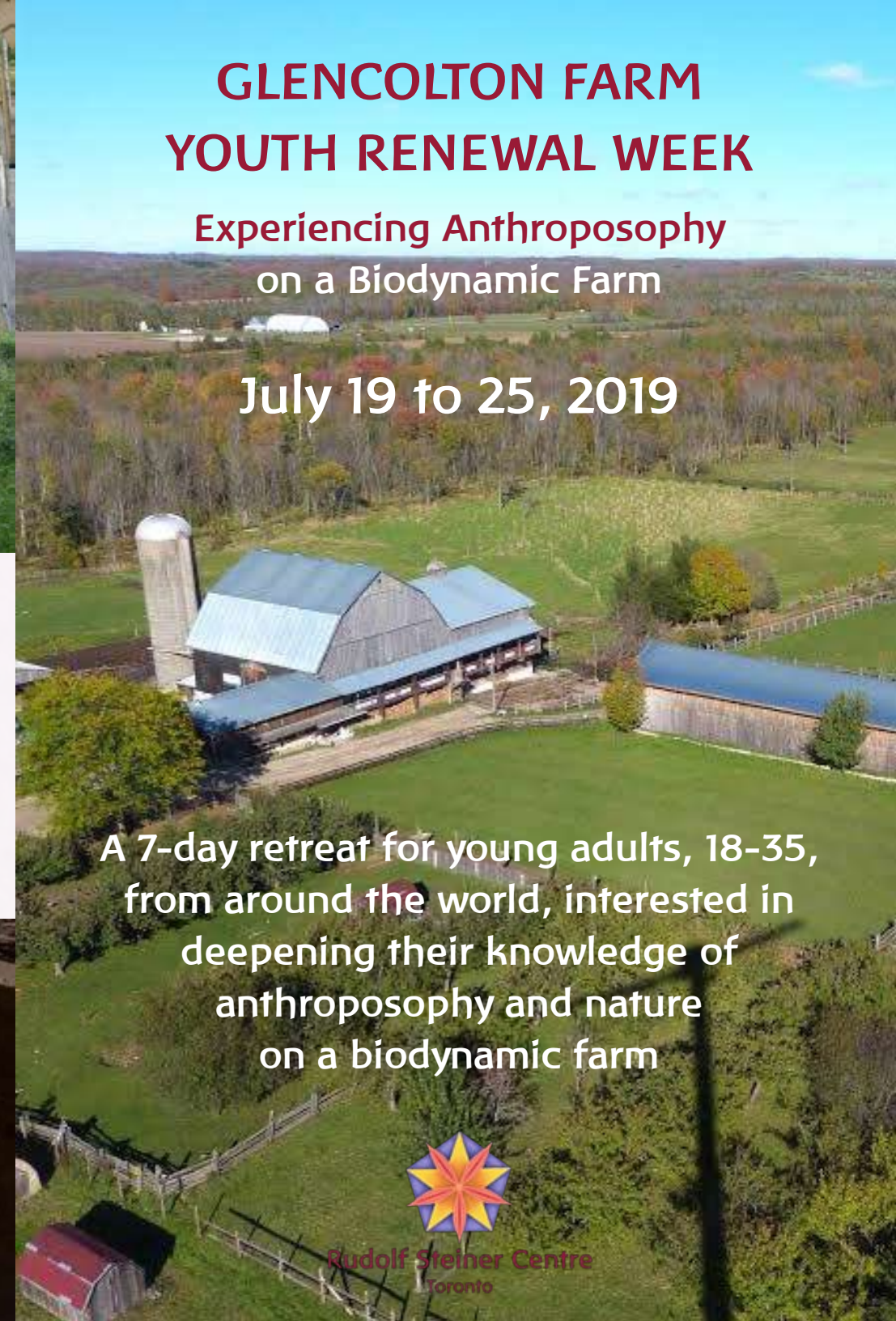

- 1:45-3:15 Practical work with Greg Scott
 - Woodwork project (musical instrument), stone carving, farm structure
- 3:30-5:00 Gardening, working with the soil with Elisa Vander Hout
- 5:00-6:00 Free Time - observation and walk
- 6:00-7:30 Prepare and share supper
- 7:30-9:00 Evening reflection
 - Blessing and welcome with elder, reflection and meditation for evening, stary sky & astronomy, fire side singing, stories and sharing
